Biography of Cedric and Cynthia Macadaeg

Parents of Seminarian Brandon Macadaeg

Cedric and Cynthia Macadaeg, both 51, have lived within the Diocese of Oakland for more than 30 years. Mr. Macadaeg was born and raised in San Francisco. Mrs. Macadaeg was born in Fort Lewis, Washington, but was raised in Salinas, California. They were married at Madonna del Sasso Catholic Church in Salinas on June 2, 1979. They have two children: Brandon (22) who is preparing to become a priest and Cheryl (20) who is preparing to become an officer for the California Highway Patrol.

They moved to the East Bay, first settling in Union City and then moving to the San Ramon Valley in 1996. Currently, they are active parishioners of St. Isidore Catholic Church in Danville and are affiliated with several ministries including, the Knights of Columbus, Opus Dei, the St. Isidore Network Group (SING), and the Filipino Parishioners of St. Isidore (FAP-SI). In addition, Mrs. Macadaeg is a regional account manager for Lighthouse Catholic Media, a company which promotes Pope John Paul II's vision of the New Evangelization by distributing informative Catholic brochures and audio discs in local parishes. She serves the Dioceses of Oakland, San Jose and Stockton, and the Archdiocese of San Francisco.

The Macadaeg's have been promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life around the Diocese of Oakland since their son, Brandon, became a seminarian in 2006. Their hope is to encourage parents to unconditionally live out their vocations as married couples by properly forming their children in our Catholic faith. They believe that children will discover the vocation God is calling them to pursue by witnessing a man and woman's generous response to God's call as married couples.

A recent email from Brandon Macadaeg for our Council

Dear Friends,

Today (18 April) my vocation director informed me that the Most Reverend Salvatore J. Cordileone, Bishop of Oakland, will be sending me to study graduate level theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, Italy for the next four years. In addition, I will be living at the Pontifical North American College (the American Seminary in Rome) where I will be engaging in priestly formation. I will be joining some of my former classmates and friends from my current seminary, Theological College in Washington D.C., as well as Derrick Oliviera, my diocesan brother.

I am deeply humbled by this assignment and I trust that the Risen Christ will sustain me during this time. Contrary to what many people think, this assignment is not about a career or about getting promotions. No. This assignment is about me growing into the identity God is calling me to. I know God is calling me to the priesthood and this is another opportunity for me to conform my life to that of Jesus Christ, the High Priest and Good Shepherd. In addition, this is about His bride--the Church. It is you the Church that is sending me to Rome and that mission comes with great responsibility--not only to know Christ better, but indeed to make Him better known to you and to all God's people. Please pray for me---I need you!!!

Before I leave, I will be finishing my philosophical studies here in Washington, DC. I have completed and submitted my Master's Thesis and am scheduled to take my oral comprehensive exam on May 6 from 2PM to 3PM EDT. This will probably be the most challenging hour of my life thus far and I will really need your prayers then as well.

I will return to California on May 19 to say goodbye. Then, I will be departing for Rome on 19 July 2009 and will not return to the United States until June 2011. But until then let us make the best of the next three months we have together.

CHURCH ACTIVITIES

- 1. 2008-09 Annual Bishops Vocation & Pastoral Recognition Dinner.** In 2008-09, Danville Council 4060 has expanded this Chapter wide fundraising event highlighting Vocations into a broad based venue highlighting the importance of local vocations
- 2. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.** This continuing project was created to provide the required attendance needed to support a 24 Hour Adoration program and, therefore, provide parishioners their own opportunity to participate.
- 3. Bagdad, Iraq Knights of Columbus Roundtable Orphanage Program.** To work with Knights of Columbus Roundtable newly formed in-country by US Service personnel. Their purpose is to provide impoverished Catholic orphans living within the Bagdad war zone with needed funds.
- 4. Annual Fall Parish Ministries Festival.** An annual opportunity to support parishioners serving with other ministries while introducing them to the opportunities offered by joining the Knights of Columbus.

COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

- 1. Danville, CA 50th Fourth of July Parade.** The 50th Fourth of July Parade is dedicated to honoring America and the sacrifices made by its military Veterans as well as to support all the Danville Organizations who have helped build our City since it was a simple farm community.
- 2. 25th Annual Christmas Basket Program.** The Danville Council #4060 Knights of Columbus Annual Christmas Basket program helps 480 needy families have a merrier Christmas by providing them a gift basket containing a fresh turkey plus food enough to provide a family of 4 one week.
- 3. Red, Blue & Gold Awards Banquet.** The Holy Spirit Assemble Red, Blue & Gold Dinner honors the sacrifices made by local law enforcement and fire safety departments. This is the 15th Annual Banquet sponsored by the Holy Spirit Assembly.
- 4. Annual Columbian Foundation MA Drive – Tootsie Roll Program.** The 2008 fund raising goal was \$5,000 which raised \$2,118 for the program, probably a reflection of a very challenging local economy

COUNCIL ACTIVITIES

- 1. "24 Hour Knight" Recruitment Program.** The "24 Hour Knight" program was designed to increase recruitment productivity by demonstrating to prospective recruits that joining The Knights actually required an annual commitment of less than 24 hours.
- 2. Membership – 2nd & 3rd Degree Exemplification Event.** The April 26th event was one of the largest single Exemplifications in the Oakland Chapter with 69 Knights assuming their 2nd Degree and 104 assuming their 3rd Degree. 15 of the newly exemplified Knights were Danville #4060 Brothers.
- 3. Entertainment Book Fund Raiser.** Raising funds for the charitable and general fund through the sale of 300+ 2009 "Entertainment Book" coupon books.
- 4. Oakland Cathedral Tour & Offsite Meeting.** The field trip/off site meeting was designed to provide another opportunity for increased fraternal association as well as an opportunity to re-activate old, dues paying but non-attending member

FAMILY ACTIVITIES

- 1. Free Knights of Columbus Parish Welcome Back Picnic.** To welcome all parishioners to the new school (and activity) year while introducing our new 24 Hour Knight concept along with an invitation to join the Knights.
- 2. Annual Parish Christmas Breakfast Fundraiser.** Starting at 7AM Sunday, the party begins. This year, in return for a \$4 adult donation, over 900 families and their children enjoyed a great, all you can eat meal.
- 3. Annual Ladies Night Dinner.** This annual Fraternal event is designed to signify the new Grand Knights assumption of his gavel and to recognize our entire Brothers' wives who selflessly give up family time all year to help make it easier for Brother Knights to accomplish our many tasks.
- 4. Family of The Month Program.** The development of a strong family base built around honest communications and respect. The Family of the Month program seeks to honor families who are good examples of these traits in action.

YOUTH ACTIVITIES

- 1. 2008 Christmas Gift Program.** The St. Isidore 5th Grade elected to bake and sell Holiday Cookies in support of the Knights of Columbus Basket Program.
- 2. Annual Essay Contest.** This program follows the general pro forma outlined in the Knights of Columbus Service Program guide. In 2008, two scholarships were awarded, \$500 and \$250 to our winning students
- 3. Annual Knights of Columbus Free-Throw Contest.** The contestant group is made up of age grouped boys and girls. All participants received a Certificate of Participation in to recognize their willingness to participate. Winners received an engraved plaque, Official Knights of Columbus Basketball and an invitation to participate in the next competitive level.
- 3. The Entertainment Book Fundraising Program.** To solicit the involvement of students and teachers in the Entertainment Book fund raising activity. In recognition of their efforts the Danville Council #4060 donated \$880 to the school to their scholarship fund for less fortunate parishioner's tuition.


